Thanks to everyone that entered and helped circulate this years draft. The IDCC made \$980.00 on this year's draft.

Inglis Grocery Store Project Update ***"My Store, My Community"***

The committee charged with investigating options to re-open the grocery store in Inglis has been working hard to determine a way forward. After reviewing a number of potential options, the committee has decided to pursue a community cooperative. Initial feasibility analysis has identified a need to raise \$100,000 in order to proceed with the project. These funds would cover the required start-up costs – building, equipment, inventory, etc. as well as some operational funds to ensure a successful start.

We have been advised by the MLCC that it may take 1 year of successful operation in order to be re-issued a permit for liquor sales. We know that this isn't ideal but we have no control over this process and feel that the store itself is viable if the community shows support through their involvement as co-op members.

To raise the \$100,000 required, the committee proposes selling co-op memberships at \$1,000 each. We have identified a deadline of August 30, 2013 to raise the required funds. Members will enjoy all of the benefits afforded by the Co-operative Model including that:

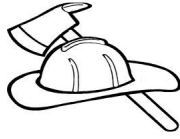
- The purpose is to provide a service and savings to members
- Members have control – one member – one vote
- The Cooperative is owned by the members who use the services
- Any Surplus is proportionally distributed to members according to patronage.

The committee wishes to make all aware that, as with any business venture, there is risk involved. Initially this will be mitigated through the assistance of the RM of Shellmouth-Boulton who will hold your \$1,000 membership in trust until the required funds are raised and the co-operative is incorporated with proper by-laws and a complete business plan in place to proceed with opening the business.

To support this worthwhile community project **please send a cheque for \$1,000 made payable to the RM of Shellmouth-Boulton before August 30, 2013 (postdated to August 30, 2013).** Please note on your cheque that the funds are for an Inglis Grocery Store Co-op membership. These funds will not be disbursed to the Co-op until the organization has been incorporated and duly formed and the \$100,000 goal has been met. If the committee is unable to meet their goal the memberships will be returned. If the goal is met the membership becomes non-refundable and the committee will hold a members meeting in early fall. At this time a Board of Directors will be elected.

Crop Fire Safety

Fires are more likely to occur on farms during harvest given the movement of machinery and vehicles through cropped fields.

Many of these fires could be prevented by taking some simple fire safety steps, conducting regular maintenance checks and keeping headers clean during harvest.

Modern harvesters have many potential ignition sources which require regular servicing and close monitoring such as:

- Bearings
- Hot Exhausts
- Turbochargers
- Electrical Circuits
- Belts

Dry straw, dust, chaff oil and leaking distillate are the perfect fuels.

Keeping headers free of these fuels is important to prevent fires.
